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<u>The Ashdon</u> <u>meteorite:</u>

The meteorite hit Ashdon on march gh 1923, 101 years ago!! The meteorite was actually witnessed falling by a thatcher named Fredrick Pratt. He was working in a wheat field when he heard a `sissling` sound and when he looked up he saw `the earth fly up like water`

The meteorite hit that hard that Fredrick found it two feet deep in the ground.

Later a person brought the meteorite and donated it to the natural history museum where it was later investigated.



The natural history museum found out that it contained:

Minerals


Foldspar

Pyroxene

Olivino

White specks of nickel-iron and other minerals that the solar system had formed 4.5 billion years ago.

The Ashdon meteorite is 12cm x 9cm x 6cm in size and it weights 1.27 kg. when it laned it actually weighed 1,3 kg but two pieces where chipped off for microscopic examination. Also the example of it in the saffron Walden museum is a plaster cast of the real thing and it was made in 1926 using the real meteorite.





Pupils from Class 2 are learning about their environment in Geography this term. They went for a walk around Ashdon and wrote interesting facts about the various things that they have seen on this exploratory walk.

Mrs. Jarmain shared with the children about the meteorite that hit Ashdon on 9th March 1923! 101 years ago! Some pupils even made it their homework to go and find out about where the meteorite landed and even went to see this at the museum! Wow!!
