On Monday November 11th, the pupils of Ashdon Primary School joined parishioners from Ashdon Baptist Church to commemorate Remembrance Day at the Ashdon memorial.

Reverend Brundritt from Ashdon Baptist Church led the solemn service, guiding the attendees through the ceremony. Mrs. Reynecke-Raybould then read a poignant prayer, honouring the brave soldiers who gave their lives protecting the country.

Following the prayer, the pupils of Ashdon Primary School participated in the two minute silence, paying their respects to the fallen. This moment of reflection allowed everyone present to remember the ultimate sacrifice made by so many during times of war.

Mr. Raybould, a retired Welsh Guard for Queen Elizabeth II, joined the Ashdon parishioners and primary school at the Ashdon War Memorial. He played the 'Last Post' on his cornet to commemorate those who have died in war.

The Remembrance Day ceremony at Ashdon was a moving display of community and reverence. By joining together, the school children and local parishioners ensured that the memory of those who served would be kept alive for generations to come.

impact he has had. Here are some lovely letters from Year 2, 3 and 4.

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


Class 3 - Writing
